Welcome to Room 6 BEFORE SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS

Students will:

- © Be at school no earlier than 8:15 am.
- © Take their shoes off before coming inside and leave them on the floor beneath their bag.
- ☺ Hang their school bag up on their hook.
- © Put their reading journal in their reading box.
- © Check that they have a sharp pencil and have their learning tools on their table.
- © Go and play outside if it is fine. If it is wet they may stay inside and play.

CLOTHING

 \odot Please ensure that your child's clothing is named.

- © The expectation is that when students take something off, they put it in their school bag.
- © It is also expected that students have a change of clothes with them at school.
- © Please discourage your child from wearing gumboots to school in Terms 1 and 4.

LIBRARY

 \odot Library day is usually a Friday.

- © Students are issued with two books to take home to enjoy for a week.
- Students must transport library books in their book bag to keep them safe.
- © Please ensure your child returns their books on or before the library day so they can be issued with new books.

RED FLAGS

- When the red flags are out in the playground it signals students may only play on the concrete and astro-turf areas due to rain or wet/muddy underfoot conditions.
- If they have a sports practice and the flags are out, they may go to practice if they have a change of clothes.

- ☺ If it is raining at playtime or lunchtime, students eat inside supervised by their teacher.

- © There is sunscreen available in class or children are very welcome to bring their own.

HEALTH & PHYSED

- © Term 1: Swimming– Please ensure your child has their togs and a towel in a waterproof bag everyday.
- © Term 1 to 4 Please ensure your child wears/brings suitable clothes for physical activities and training.
- © As physical activities are part of the school curriculum, a note is required if your child is unable to take part.
- © Tissues are available in classrooms and your child is very welcome to bring their own to use as well.

LITERACY

- ☺ Instructional reading is taken Monday through to Thursday.
- © Please ensure home reading journals are returned each day along with any school reading books.
- © The journals have a built-in reward system with every 25 nights of home reading recognised with a certificate.
- Spelling will be based on the Joy Allcock Switch on to Spelling approach. Please see the classroom teacher for any queries. Students will be tested on the Essential Spelling Lists in term 1 and 3.

NUMERACY

- © Students in our class will work in ability groups. These will begin once assessments are complete.
- Showledge and strategy will be 60-80% of our focus. Please encourage plenty of regular practise of number knowledge and basic facts at home.

RELIEVERS

 \odot When a reliever is in our class, the expectations remain the same.

HOMEWORK

- So We encourage you to read with your child every night and take time to discuss the book. Please record a positive comment in the reading journal.
- © Maths homework will be sent home on Mondays and is due back each Friday.
